Substation Site - Barkers, Terminus Road, Eastbourne.


I refer to the recent telephone conversation between Mr. Lumb and Mr. Roberts in regard to the above.

According to our records, the substation accommodation was provided in 1932 by your predecessors, Messrs. Dale & Kerley, in order to afford them an electricity supply but there is no formal document held by the Board concerning this matter.

In accordance with the terms of the Three Part Tariff under which the Company's premises are supplied, it is, however, a condition that the consumer shall provide and maintain without cost to the Board suitable accommodation for the Board's apparatus.

For your information, I attach a copy of the application form signed on behalf of the Company together with explanatory leaflet giving details of the special conditions which form an integral part of the tariff.

(5) **Maximum demand**

The monthly maximum demand in kilowatts shall be either twice the largest number of units supplied in any half hour of that month or

85 per cent of twice the largest number of kilovolt ampere hours supplied in any half hour of that month

whichever shall be the greater.

“Chargeable maximum demand” in each year of account shall be the highest of the monthly maximum demands in that year.

(6) **Fuel cost**

The expression “fuel cost per ton” means the fuel cost per ton used for the purposes of and shown on the invoice for the supply of electricity in bulk by the Central Electricity Generating Board to the Board in the previous month.

(7) **Accounts**

Monthly accounts shall be rendered to the Consumer as soon as practicable after the end of each calendar month. Each such account shall include, in addition to the basic unit charges and one-twelfth of the annual service charge, an amount based on an estimate of the chargeable maximum demand for the year of account. The maximum demand charge for the twelfth month (i.e. March) will be adjusted to collect the full maximum demand charges for the year of account.

Part B

This tariff is available for electricity supplied at one point on any premises where the maximum power required is 50 kilovolt amperes or more. It is not applicable to electricity supplied for standby purposes for which the Board will be pleased to quote special terms on request. Consumers adopting this tariff may change to another tariff only at the end of a year of account.

The charges for electricity and the special conditions are as follows:

CHARGES

1. **Annual Service Charge**
For each kilovolt ampere of authorised maximum power in each year of account
2. **Annual demand charge**
For the chargeable maximum demand made in each year of account
 - Low or medium voltage**
For each of the first 200 kilowatts
For each of the next 300 kilowatts
For each additional kilowatt
 - High voltage**
For each of the first 500 kilowatts
For each additional kilowatt
3. **Unit charges**
For each of the first 150 units supplied per month per kilowatt of maximum demand made in that month
For each additional unit supplied in the same month
 - Night use**
Where use at night is regular and substantial the Board will, at the request of the consumer, install metering equipment to register separately the units supplied between the hours of 9 p.m. and 7 a.m. and such units will instead be charged at
 - Fuel cost adjustment**
For each penny by which the fuel cost per ton is more or less than 85s. the unit charges will be increased or reduced by

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

These conditions form an integral part of the tariff.

(1) Accommodation on Consumer's premises

The Consumer shall provide and maintain without cost to the Board suitable accommodation on the premises for the Board's electric lines and apparatus necessary to provide, control and meter the supply. Such lines and apparatus shall remain the property of the Board and may also be used for supplying other consumers.

(2) Voltage of delivery and metering

The Board will decide the position of the supply terminals and the voltage at which the supply will be delivered and metered.

(3) Month—Year of Account

Meters will be read as near as practicable to the last day of each calendar month for the purpose of ascertaining the number of units supplied and the maximum demand made.

“Month” means the period between one such reading and the next.

“Year of account” means the period from the date of commencement of supply until the meter reading nearest to the next following 31st March and thereafter means twelve consecutive months ending on the 31st March.

(4) Authorised maximum power

Maximum power will be authorised in blocks commencing at 50 kilovolt amperes and increasing by 25 kilovolt amperes or multiples thereof to 300 kilovolt amperes, thereafter by 50 kilovolt amperes or multiples thereof to 800 kilovolt amperes and subsequently by 100 kilovolt amperes or multiples thereof.

The authorised maximum power for any Consumer shall be that block of kilovolt amperes which is most nearly equal to, but not less than, the maximum power requested by the Consumer at the time of application for a new supply or as subsequently amended by arrangement with the Board.

The issue of this form does not indicate that the Board can make a supply of electricity available. Applicants should ascertain from the Board that a supply can be made available before they decide to spend money on wiring their premises or making any other preparations to use the supply.

Adjustment of Service Charge from 1st December, 1967.

CONDITIONS AS TO METERING EQUIPMENT

1. Such metering equipment as the Board may require for ascertaining the value of the supply shall be provided fixed and maintained by the Board and shall remain the Board's property.
2. The metering equipment shall consist of a kilowatt hour meter or meters for measuring the number of units supplied and a demand indicator or indicators for ascertaining the kilowatts (and, where the Board deem it necessary, the kilovolt amperes) of maximum demand.
3. The Consumer shall not interfere, or permit any person not being an officer or servant of the Board to interfere, in any way with the metering equipment
4. If the metering equipment shall be lost, destroyed or damaged by whatsoever cause (excepting only by fair wear and tear or by act of an officer or servant of the Board) the Consumer shall pay to the Board the cost of repairing or replacing the equipment and otherwise making good the damage.
5. As to that portion of the metering equipment which cannot be certified or approved under the Electricity Acts
 - (a) the metering equipment shall be deemed to be accurate unless its accuracy is disputed by notice in writing by the Board or the Consumer given to the other of them.
 - (b) if any such notice is given the metering equipment shall be tested by a method to be agreed between the Consumer and the Board or, in default of agreement, to be decided by a person nominated by the President for the time being of the Institution of Electrical Engineers and if necessary the metering equipment shall be recalibrated by the Board
 - (c) if the metering equipment ceases to register or is found by test as provided in (b) above to be inaccurate beyond the limits of reasonable tolerance, any account in respect of the month in which the metering equipment ceased to register or in respect of the month immediately preceding the notice of dispute and any subsequent month in respect of which readings have been taken from the same metering equipment (as the case may be) shall be adjusted in accordance with an estimate of the units supplied and of the chargeable maximum demand (if any) during such month or months.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF SUPPLY

Electricity will be supplied in accordance with the provisions of the Electricity Acts, Regulations and Orders for the time being in force.

The following notes are intended to explain the effect of some of the provisions of the said Acts, Regulations and Orders but they are not exhaustive and are intended only for the guidance of consumers:—

1. *Service Lines and Apparatus.* The Board may require the Consumer to contribute towards the cost of any lines required to provide the supply but such lines shall remain the property of the Board and may be used for supplying other consumers
2. *Testing and Installation.* The Board may require to inspect and test the Consumer's installation before connecting the supply. The Consumer should inform the Board of any proposed extension or alterations of his installation so that the Board may if they wish make an inspection and test of the extension or alteration.

The first inspection and test of an installation or any extension or alteration thereof is made without charge to the Consumer. If the results of any inspection or test are unsatisfactory a further inspection and test will be necessary for which a charge (to be paid in advance) will be made.

These inspections and tests are made for the Board's purposes only. Approval of an installation does not imply any warranty that the installation is suitable for the Consumer's purposes, and the Board accepts no responsibility for any loss or damage caused by or arising out of any defect in the Consumer's installation.
3. *Authorised Maximum Power.* The authorised maximum power is the extent of supply provided by the Board to meet the maximum power required by the consumer as stated on the front of this Application. The consumer is not entitled to make a demand in excess of the authorised maximum power and if he should desire to do so he should make application to the Board in time to allow arrangements to be made to increase the authorised maximum power accordingly.
4. *Earthing.* The responsibility for earthing a Consumer's installation is his own. It is therefore for him to ensure that adequate arrangements are provided and maintained for so doing.

The Consumer shall not for earthing purposes connect his installation to any part of the Board's apparatus except with the permission of the Board who shall not be responsible for any loss or damage arising out of any such connection.
5. *Security for Payments.* The Board may require the Consumer to give security for payments for electricity supplied, and if such security is not given the Board may withhold or suspend supply. Notwithstanding any such security payments for supply are due on demand.
6. *Access to Consumer's Premises.* Authorised officers of the Board are entitled at all reasonable times to enter the premises for purposes connected with the supply.
7. *Interference with Supply to Other Consumers.* The Consumer must not use the supply so as to interfere with the efficient supply of electricity to any other consumers and the Board may suspend the supply in such an event. In particular attention is drawn to the following:—
 - (i) The power factor at which the supply is used should be kept as near unity as possible and should certainly not be allowed to be less than 0.85 when the Consumer's demand is at or near its maximum.
 - (ii) When two or more phases are provided the demand should be balanced as nearly as practicable between the phases.
 - (iii) No apparatus may be used which adversely affects the public supply.
(N.B. To ensure compliance with the requirements consumers who desire to use the supply for power purposes are advised to obtain further information which is available without charge at any of the Board's district offices.)
8. *Temporary Interruption.* The Board may temporarily discontinue the supply for purposes of testing or for any other purposes whatsoever connected with the proper working of the Board's system, or in case of emergency affecting or liable to affect the proper working of any other undertaking from which the Board receive a supply of electricity directly or indirectly.
9. *Disconnection.* The Board are entitled to disconnect the supply for non-payment in full on demand for the supply and also in certain other circumstances including those mentioned in paragraphs 5 and 7 above. The cost of disconnection and any reconnection shall be borne by the Consumer.
