"That the said Edward Maynard his appointees heirs or assigns shall not nor will without the previous consent in writing of the said William Earl of Burlington his heirs appointees or assigns and of the persons for the time being entitled as aforesaid exercise or carry on or suffer to be exercised or carry on upon the said premises hereby granted released and surrendered or any part thereof the trade or business of a Slaughterman melter of fat fallow chandler tobacco pipe burner soapmaker soapboiler sugar baker fellmongers hide or skin dresser sizer distiller tanner lighterman scavenger or any other offensive occupation trade or business whatsoever"
